Glossary of Terms

Demo: Short for demolition. Knocking out and removing old items, materials, wall coverings, or walls inside the home. It's the first step of the remodel, which opens up and clears the space for renovations and upgrades.

HVAC: An acronym standing for heating, ventilation, and air conditioning. An HVAC contractor handles these systems to ensure the house is properly heated, cooled, and ventilated.

Mechanicals: The systems inside the walls and ceilings such as electrical, plumbing, and HVAC that essentially power the home.

Subcontractor: A specialty contractor, like a plumber or electrician, who's hired by the general contractor to perform specific work.

Pulling a Permit: The process of obtaining official approval from the local government or relevant authority to carry out specific renovations or construction work on a property.

CAD: Computer-aided design. This is software that is used to design/modify spaces to improve communications to everyone involved in the project.

As Built Plans: An accurate drawing of the existing space and how it is laid out. This includes doors/windows/electrical. This is required by the city to obtain a permit.

Proposed Planset: This a CAD drawing of the new design/layout that is being proposed. The city requires this along with the As Built Plans in order to obtain a permit.
